



Orange Show Speedway Racers Auxiliary

Overall Guidelines

- ❖ The goal of the Orange Show Speedway Racers Auxiliary (OSSRA) is to provide a family-oriented environment by making it more affordable to the racers and their families to attend while additionally creating assistance for Orange Show Speedway (OSS) off-site and track activities.
- ❖ The structure of scheduled volunteers is to provide representation from as many divisions participating that evening, as possible. In that way, volunteers will get every opportunity to see their family member's racing activities.
- ❖ Although you are volunteering your time, you are participating in the Speedway as a reliable, trustworthy, and contributing member of the team. You are representing yourself, your team or organization, the OSS and OSSRA. Your actions will reflect on all of these parties.
- ❖ Respect the Speedway culture at OSS. The people working at the Speedway have the experience with and commitment to the track. Share your ideas and feedback in a constructive manner.
- ❖ Please dress appropriately for the type of service you will be conducting. If you are working outdoors or with some hands-on project, remember to wear close toed shoes and other protective outerwear.
- ❖ As you begin your service with OSS Racers Auxiliary, you are probably eager to get involved and make a difference in the lives of the people with whom you will be working. We expect that you will view yourself as a representative of Orange Show Speedway, and as such, we ask that you carefully read through and abide by the following guidelines to ensure you will have the most meaningful and worthwhile volunteer experience possible.
- ❖ Although you may not see the immediate outcome of the service you perform, there can be value in every volunteer project, even the most simple. Your presence as a volunteer is appreciated and essential to the Speedway.
- ❖ Remember that you are being given complimentary access to the speedway for the evening with the consent of the OSS for the sole reason and expectation of your commitment to volunteer as a member of the OSSRA and during the time you are not spending and supporting your family. Some activities may push you beyond your comfort zone. Be open to new experiences and challenges but be aware of your boundaries and voice any questions or concerns.

When You First Arrive at the Site

- ❖ A pass list will be at the Pit Gate Entrance (Gate 11) with names of all scheduled individuals receiving a complimentary wristband for the evening.
- ❖ Please note that if you are not scheduled to work that evening, you will be responsible for any fees to obtain entrance to the speedway thru the pit gate or fan entrances.
- ❖ At the assigned time, please make your way to the merchandise store located at the OSS' North Grandstand and locate the supervisor to discuss assignments and needs for the evening. Make sure you are clear as to your role within at the Speedway that evening.

❖ Confidentiality and Risk Management Concerns

- ❖ If you are feeling uncertain about a situation, ask before you act. Practice common sense and don't be afraid to ask for clarification or help.
- ❖ Do not share personal contact information with service site clients. If you feel that this would be appropriate, discuss it with the site supervisor.
- ❖ *Be aware that you can say "NO" to a task when you feel the request is inappropriate, beyond your skill level and depth of knowledge or if you perceive a situation to be unsafe physically or emotionally.*
- ❖ ***This list is not exhaustive. Always follow the rules and regulations of a given service site.***
- ❖ ***Know your rights as a volunteer. When in doubt...ask and FIND OUT!***
- ❖ ***NEVER*** report to volunteer under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- ❖ ***NEVER*** give or loan a fan money or other personal belongings.
- ❖ ***NEVER*** give a fan your address or telephone number.
- ❖ ***NEVER*** make promises or commitments to a fan you cannot keep.
- ❖ ***NEVER*** give a fan or staff member a ride in a personal vehicle while volunteering.
- ❖ ***NEVER*** tolerate verbal exchange of a sexual nature or engage in behavior that might be perceived as sexual with a fan, racer, or staff member.
- ❖ Use common sense and conduct yourself in a professional manner at all times. Familiarize yourself with the workings of the speedway. This will contribute to the success of your volunteer experience.
